Safe Play Area Is there a securely fenced safe play area for children? Is the safe play area separated from farm machinery, animals,	YES NO
bodies of water and other hazards? Is the area visible from the house? Is there adequate shade and interesting things for children to do? Are there 'out of bounds' rules in place so that children know where they are not allowed to play?	
Vehicles, Machinery & Bikes Are children appropriately restrained when travelling in vehicles on the farm? Is there a rule that children never ride in the back of utes/trailers or as passengers on tractors? Are children taught to keep away from tractors and machinery? Are keys removed from tractors and machinery and stored where children cannot access them, when not in use? Is there a rule that children under 16 years cannot drive or ride as a passenger on quad bikes? Are all children and adults over the age of 16 who are allowed to use quad bikes, properly trained and do they use appropriate safety equipment?	YES NO
Animals Are animal pens and stockyards inaccessible to children? Are children always supervised when near animals or when riding horses? Are children only allowed to ride horses suited to their age and riding ability? Do children wear the appropriate safety gear when riding horses?	YES NO
